




What is Social Emotion Learning?(SEL)

Social Emotional Learning is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply knowledge, skills and attitudes to:

- develop healthy identities
- manage emotions
- achieve personal goals
- feel and show empathy
- establish and maintain supportive relationships
- make responsible decisions.




Features of Social Emotion Learning



Some key terms in Social Emotional Learning - match


- 1/ Involves understanding and empathising with others' perspectives, feelings, and needs.
- 2/ This competency involves developing and maintaining, healthy relations with peers teachers, and family members.
- 3/ This competency involves making informed, ethical, and constructive choices about personal and social behaviour.



Benefits of teaching SEL competencies in EFL contexts – again, can you match?

1/ Students who have strong SEL skills tend to have better academic outcomes. Learners are more engaged in the classroom.

2/ SEL skills help students manage stress, build resilience, and develop coping strategies, c) Improved academic which can improve their mental health and enhances emotional intelligence.


3/ SEL skills help students develop positive relationships with their peers and teachers, which creates a more supportive and inclusive classroom environment.








Teaching SEL in EFL Contexts




- Teach SEL explicitly
- SEL allows for higher order thinking, collaboration ,wellbeing
- SEL is a process /continuum not a curriculum



Teaching SEL in EFL Contexts


"Start where you are.
Use what you have.
Do what you can."

- Contextualise depending on the circumstance
- SEL encompasses critical thinking



SEL as inclusive practice in EFL classrooms

- ✓Welcoming Inclusion Activities: Begin each class with activities that build community and connect to the lesson. Such as greeting each person by name od group activity.
- ✓ Engaging Activities: Incorporate teaching strategies like 'think pair, share', mirror activity to promote interactive learning and consider various learning styles.
- ✓ Equitable Learning Environments:SEL strategies create classrooms that are inclusive of all learners, respecting cultures and backgrounds. SEL seeks to respect equity and diversity.
- ✓ Optimistic Closure: Classes end with a reflective activity that highlights the importance of the work and is forward-thinking.



Games as warmers: starters, fillers, coolers

- Cooperative games/board games
- Conversational games
- Short less strenuous physical exercises



Group work

- Promotes collaboration
- Fosters problem-solving skills
- Enhances critical thinking



Pair work

- Promotes collaboration
- Fosters problem-solving skills
- Enhances critical thinking




