- set up tangible and time bound goals to support students through the development of writing



You can use realia to create descriptive styles that appeal to the five senses, to give a clear picture. Observation of real objects can be used to teach writing in class, when students write a short narrative text eg. about the reusable worth of a plastic bottle.

It provides a visual aid to engage students and get them to participate








Examples of realia

- a stone
- a statue
- newspapers
- things they see on a visit to a place of interest on the school premises





Story club

Motivate students to create short stories about things they see at school events. This can be done in pairs/groups. The teacher's edited versions could be used to create a compilation of stories. How could you do this in your context?

Role play

Short fun activities with cultural artifacts (eg. baskets, brooms etc) for example, a market scene or a cultural display can be created.

Students will then write their observations as short stories.

Keeping journals or diaries


Encourage students to write a journal on a visit to school farm. They can focus on specific realia eg. soil, plants, rakes and what they are for.

This could serve as reference to the development of the plants.



Following directions Motivate learners to write a description of how to locate their school or house, based on landmarks eg. a large old mango tree, a wall.





Students' realia (in their bag / or things they bring in):


Use this to create group writing activities in the classroom eg. 'I am an apple. I was born in ...'



Short trips in the school premises:

Students can be taken to the sport facility, the school clinic etc. for observation and be motivated to write about the realia they see in these contexts eg. medicines, bed, sports equipment





Island survival

Give students a scenario to think critically about after a visit to a place on the school premises and write an imaginative story in pairs/group eg. 'Imagine this is an island and you and your group have been living here for a month' Bring into class a few items to remind them and support their imagination.

You could allow the fastest group to present.
