## Ranking

'Ranking is a great activity for learners to develop their critical thinking skills. They need to think about and justify the choices they make. It's also a good way for them to practise communication. I often write short prompts on the board to help them during the discussion phase.'

Stage 1: Preparation	Either write the following list on the board or dictate it to the learners:  • kind  • honest  • funny  • reliable  • generous  • helpful  • clever  • good looking.  Check that they understand all the adjectives.
Stage 2: Individual	Say: 'Which of these adjectives is most important in a friend? Rank these adjectives in the order of importance. 1 is the most important; 8 is the least important. You have two minutes.'
Stage 3: Share useful phrases	On the board write some useful phrases for giving opinions, agreeing and disagreeing. For example:  I think  In my opinion  I agree/disagree because  So do I.  I can see your point, but
Stage 4: Discuss in pairs	Put the learners in pairs and say: 'Compare your choices and try to come to an agreement. Use the phrases to help you. You have four minutes.'  Monitor and help where necessary.
Stage 5: Share	Ask a few pairs to share their ranking and give reasons for their choices. Note that there is no 'correct' answer to this activity.

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
